Life and Domestic Violence

Susan Still, Domestic Violence Survivor

Susan Still is a domestic violence survivor whose case is unique in several ways. Her former husband, Ulner Lee Still, had one of their children videotape him beating Susan up. Her husband was convicted and sentenced to 36 years in prison, which was the longest term ever given in a domestic violence case. Susan appeared on Oprah Winfrey's show on May 8, 2007 to share her horrendous story and will travel to Lynchburg to share her experiences.

Danger Assessment

Jacquelyn C. Campbell, PhD, RN, FAAN

Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs/Professor, Johns Hopkins University

Jacquelyn Campbell, PhD, RN is the Anna D. Wolf Chair and a Professor in the Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing with a joint appointment in the Bloomberg School of Public Health. Her BSN, MSN and PhD are from Duke University, Wright State University and the University of Rochester. She has been conducting advocacy policy work and research in the area of domestic violence since 1980. Dr. Campbell has been the PI of 10 major NIH, NIJ or CDC research grants and published more than 150 articles and seven books on this subject. She is an elected member of the Institute of Medicine and the American Academy of Nursing and on the Boards of Directors of the Family Violence Prevention Fund and the House of Ruth Battered



In addition to the presentations by both renowned speakers, Dr. Campbell will employ the danger assessment using Ms. Still's experience as an example. In an effort to enhance the safety and overall wellbeing of survivors, conference participant's can take an on-site post-training Danger Assessment Certification test to become certified to conduct danger assessments with identified and non-identified victims of family violence.
