"If you looked up everyone in the country with the same name as you, what would you find? What patterns would you see? For director Angela Shelton, the answer was a group of women that shared a history of sexual abuse, rape, and incest. This harrowing discovery leads Shelton down a path of self-examination and, ultimately, to the doorstep of her father, who himself was a pedophile and a rapist. The nationally renowned, award-winning film has already spawned a movement of sorts and is being used as a catalyst to get survivors of abuse to share their experiences."

These events are part of the celebration of the creation of the Foothills Child Advocacy Center, a safe, child-friendly setting for the investigation of child abuse, neglect, and victimization, and provision of helpful services to child victims.
